Description: Episode 1, Dr. Michael Doxtater; 42 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Dr. Michael Doxtater, Indigenous Knowledge Keeper. Michael

discusses the importance of connecting to culture as a vital part of Indigenous justice.

Description: Episode 2, Aronhiaies Herne; 47 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Aronhiaies Herne, Mohawk Indigenous Knowledge Keeper who

shares with us knowledge about Haudenosaunee Midwinter Teachings.

Description: Episode 3, Terrylynn Brant; 56 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Terrylynn Brant, Indigenous Seed Keeper and Educator at Six Nations of the Grand River. Terrylynn shares with us about teaching Indigenous Knowledge to her family in a pandemic and the importance of seed saving and food sovereignty.

Description: Episode 4, Jennifer Mt. Pleasant; 23 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Jennifer Mt. Pleasant, Educator and Researcher of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Men and Boys. Jennifer shares with us about how she developed a database of missing and murdered Indigenous men and boys and how the process affected her.

Description: Episode 5, Hickory Edwards; 27 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Hickory Edwards who shares what motivates him to organize and complete the annual Haudenosaunee Canoe Journey through Haudenosaunee traditional waterways each summer.

Description: Episode 6, Darren Montour; 41 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Six Nations Police Services Chief of Police, Darren Montour. Darren shares his thoughts regarding Indigenous policing on Six Nations of the Grand River

Territory.

Description: Episode 7, Marc Miller; 33 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Minister of Indigenous Services, Marc Miller. On this episode, Minister Miller shares his thoughts on Indigenous people and the pandemic and we also discuss the most recent uncovering of the unmarked grave of children at Kamloops Indian Residential School.

Description: Episode 8, Kelly Boutsalis; 29 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is journalist, Kelly Boutsalis who shares with us about how she brings education and understanding to people through the stories she writes about Indigenous people.

Description: Episode 9, Cloe VanEvery; 25 minutes

Episode Topic: Today's guest is youth, Cloe VanEvery from the Mohawk nation. Cloe shares

with us, her perspective as an Indigenous youth on the topic of residential schools.

Description: Episode 10, Nicole Hill-Dolson

Episode Topic: Today's guest is Nicole Hill-Dolson, a lawyer from Oneida of the Thames who shares about the motivation she received from her grandmother, a residential school survivor of the Mohawk Institute. We'll also talks about being an Indigenous lawyer in the justice system.
